Celebrating the Season of Lent



Holy Week:

This is the holiest week in the church year, the holiest week for the Christian faith. Later that evening, Jesus was arrested by the authorities in the Garden of Gethsemane, beginning his journey to Calvary and to Easter.

As we enter into Holy Week, take time to reflect upon the scenes of Jesus' last days. Place yourself in the story, envisioning your response to all that is happening? How would you have responded? And reflect this week in prayer: what is the significance of these events for my life now and for the life of the world?
